NEW STATE PROGRAMS

WRAP (Women's Religious Assistance Program)

A new program called - "Women's Religious Assistance Program" to encourage great participation from each and every member as they put their Faith into Action.

This program will not only promote assistance to the Women's Religious Orders but also to foster relationships with our nuns and sisters. We can help them in their needs as well as show them our full support in their service to humanity.

Like many other Religious Orders, the Women's Religious Orders have encountered many challenges over the years. There has been decline in membership, nuns are vanishing at an alarming rate, physical and financial hardship as they struggle to survive, and difficulty supporting the needs of the community they serve. According to recent studies made by the US National Religious Vocation Conference, there had been a 66% significant drop of nuns in the United States over four decades. That means if no one acts and helps the present trend, women's religious life as we have known will just remain a memory.

Catholics and communities need to step forward and help preserve Women's Religious Orders. Our Nation needs them as much as they need us. We have to continue to work together for God's greater Glory. We have to carry on the work that Pope Francis initiated for us and that is the plan to lead the World's Catholics along a journey of intensified action in caring for God's creation.

Campesinos (Farmworkers) Program

In line with St. Mother Teresa's concern for the needy and the poor and her "together we can do great things", this program will initiate for the farmworkers and their families BOX of HOPE, The GIFT of WARMTH, and SHOWER of LOVE.

Through BOX of HOPE, the Knights, on days before Christmas, will deliver boxes of food for a Christmas Dinner to families in need. This activity is in line with the Family Programs' Food for Families.

Through The GIFT of WARMTH, Knights will provide children and young adults coats to keep them warm during cold weather. This activity is in line with the Community Programs' Coats for Kids.

Through SHOWER of LOVE, the Knights of Columbus will provide support, like a collection of items for a baby (diapers, clothes, bottles, etc) for pregnant women, mothers and their new children. This activity is in line with Life Programs' Aid and Support After Pregnancy (ASAP).

HOLY HOURS

Wasting Time With Jesus

Our Past State Chaplain Antony Vazhappily recently wrote a book about Eucharistic Adoration called "Wasting Time With Jesus." This tongue-in-cheek title emphasizes the fact that spending time with Jesus in Eucharistic Adoration is, in actuality, a most valuable use of one's time. This book is dedicated to the Knights stating: "May these gentlemen find strength in adoration and be models of prayer in every generation! May they promote adoration in every parish."

For twenty years our Past Supreme Knight Carl Anderson told us we the Knights of Columbus are the Knights of the Eucharist and now, since the moment of his acceptance speech, our current Supreme Knight tells us the same thing, over and over. How can we, as Knights, take this title to heart? While we are encouraged to promote formal Holy Hours and invite as many souls as possible, what is most important is that you, my Brother Knight, personally, make Eucharistic Adoration a central part of your life.

In his book, Fr Vazhappily actually suggests you "spend an hour every day with our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament. . . It may be challenging; you may believe you cannot afford such time. You can't afford NOT to do this. Even if an hour per day is impossible, surely you can find time on a regular basis if it becomes important enough for you." Our current State Chaplain ,Fr Raymund Reyes, told all the Knights at the recent State District Deputy Meeting to". become more intentional in our personal encounter of Jesus. . create a space for God in our lives. . . [making Jesus] the center in our life and not just a part of our life. . . we can do this by establishing a habit of having a holy hour of adoration at least once a month. . . to come face to face with the living God. It is a great act to intentionally deepen our personal encounter with our Lord before the Blessed Sacrament."

There are many resources for making holy hours. . We are here to help. I recently created http://www.holyhour.org which includes a holy hour to pray for priests and vocations that I wrote in collaboration with Bishop Timothy Freyer. In our Council every Lent we conduct the Holy Hour of St Gemma Galgani to meditate on the Agony in the Garden. Knights in our Council have cried during this holy hour.

As our current State Deputy has dedicated this Colombian year to St Mother Teresa I will close with a quote from Carl Anderson on this great saint of our time. "Although the world praised Mother Teresa for feeding the poor and bandaging the sick, secular media often ignored the only part of her day that was absolutely consistent and, in her view, vital - the hour she spent, every single day, in Eucharistic adoration."

VISIBILITY CAMPAIGN

"You are the light of the world. A city set on a hill cannot be hidden. Nor do men light a lamp and put it under a bushel, but on a stand, and it gives light to all in the house. Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father who is in heaven. (Matthew 5:13-16)

How do we have our light shine?

One way is to have at least one event on a Sunday every month or ideally an event every Sunday in church like Prayers in the Pew, in front of the church like fundraisers for parish programs, or near the church or in conjunction with parish events. This way the parishioners see with their own eyes the different activities your council does in the parish. Hopefully these events will make them more curious about the Knights of Columbus, entice them to know more about our fraternity, and encourage and motivate them to join.

Another way is to have short writeups/captions of your council events, together with action photos (Note: action photos and no firing squad photos) released in your council's facebook account and/or through the state website and state facebook.
