What are the different "Women's Religious Orders" in California?


- To list a few from the Southern-most part of California:

 - Sisters of Servants of the Blessed Sacrament (Bonita).






What are the different "Women's Religious Orders" in California?

 - Congregation of Sisters of Nazareth (San Rafael),
 - Missionaries of Charity (Pacifica), Daughters of Charity of St Vincent de Paul (Daly City),











What are the different "Women's Religious Orders" in California?

- The following are some of the Religious Orders located in Northern California:
 - Sisters of Notre Dame de Namur (Belmont),
 - Society of Helpers (San Bruno),
 - Daughters of Carmel (Menlo Park), Daughters of St Paul (Menlo Park),
 - Sisters for Christian Community (East Palo Alto),
 - Daughters of Mary and Joseph (Mill Valley), and
 - Dominican Sisters of Mission San Jose (Fremont).







Why do they need our Support?

- Decline in membership, nuns are vanishing at an alarming rate, physical and financial hardship as they struggled to survive, and difficulty supporting the needs of the community they serve.
- According to recent studies made by the US National Religious Vocation Conference, there had been a 66% significant drop of nuns in the United States over four decades.
- If no one will act and help the present trend, women's religious life as we have known will just remain a memory.





Why do they need our Support?

- Catholics and communities need to step forward and help preserve Women's Religious Orders.
- Our Nation need them as much as they need us. We have to continue to work together for God's greater Glory.
- We have to carry on the work that Pope Francis initiated for us Lead the World's Catholics along a journey of intensified action in caring for God's creation.

- Meet with the WRO's leadership and discuss how we can assist.
- We can help provide financial assistance to their planned activities.
- We have all the manpower to aid them with food donations and distributions in their respective communities.
- We can provide any help needed in the shelters run by the religious orders.

How do we track/document support?

- To monitor our assistance, either financially or physically, we need to track by documenting them regularly.
- Each council must document and show the kind of assistance they offered and provided to all the different Women's Religious Orders in their respective communities.
- This documentation should be submitted like any other Service Program activity to the State Council under the Faith Category.


